

## Thoughts....

- If there is a new wolf management plan there should be a percent on the number of Wolves that can be harvested.
- We have seen Wolf control programs in the past and the Moose and Caribou populations rebounded very well from them.
- If Government can start managing Wolves we shouldn't ever have to see another Wolf control program.
- There was a capture program for the Chisana Caribou from 2002 to 2006, no Wolf control. The program costs were in the millions and a lot of people put a lot of hard work into the project.
- We have often found where Wolves have killed Calves, Cows and Bulls from this herd.
- From my personal observations I would say that a big reason for the decline in the Chisana Caribou was due to the predation by Wolves.
- We have had a Yukon Wolf Conservation and Management plan that clearly didn't work for this herd of Caribou or for any other herd of Caribou in the Yukon.
- From all the feedback from all the public meetings I would say this past plan didn't work for the Moose populations either.

This new plan has to give Government the direction to start managing the Wolves in the Yukon. This new plan also needs to have recommendations that Government and the people of the Yukon can and will follow.
