## BRIEFING NOTE

The SLWCC regular meeting was held in Whitehorse, Yukon on June 26, 2009. The following is a summary of meeting highlights. Detailed minutes are available from the committee.

1. Responses on caribou recommendations have been received from the following parties: Teslin Tlingit Council, Champagne and Aishihik First Nations, Carcross/Tagish First Nation, Canada and BC. Comments from the following parties are outstanding: Yukon government, Kwanlin Dun First Nation, Ta'an Kwachan Council and Taku River Tlingit First Nation. Comments were due January 30, 2009. Members encourage responses from the parties.
2. The new website address for the committee is [www.southernlakeswildlife.ca](http://www.southernlakeswildlife.ca). Please help us spread the word about our work and add a link to our site from your site.
3. Public meetings were recently held in Teslin, Carcross and Whitehorse to hear input for moose recommendations. We have produced a document based on what we heard at the meetings. The document is intended to inspire additional dialogue and obtain feedback from the public. The document will be circulated to the distribution list, placed in the newspaper and added to the website.
4. The committee discussed the structure of the regional moose assessment and identified information gaps.
5. A request will be submitted to the Yukon Fish and Wildlife Management Board to obtain files related to moose work they have completed that may assist the committee in developing recommendations.
6. The committee is requesting their parties assemble a summary of information relating to moose that can be used in the assessment.
7. The committee has assembled moose management alternatives put forward at the public meetings. The committee will add to these alternatives. The recommendations will be developed by paring down these alternatives using pre-determined criteria.
8. The next committee meeting is scheduled for September 10 – 11.
